

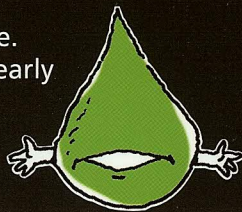
WHAT'S YOUR TIMER UP TO?



Use Water Watch to make **DAILY TIMER ADJUSTMENTS** based on current weather conditions

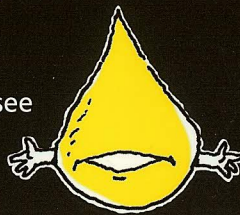
GREEN DROP DAY

The outlook is for sunshine. Water moderately, in the early morning or late evening. Watch runoff, and never water more than your landscape needs.



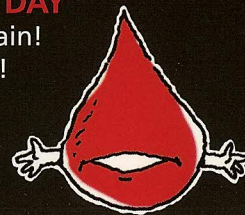
YELLOW DROP DAY

There might be rain. There might be wind. Don't water until you see if your landscape gets moisture or until the winds die down.

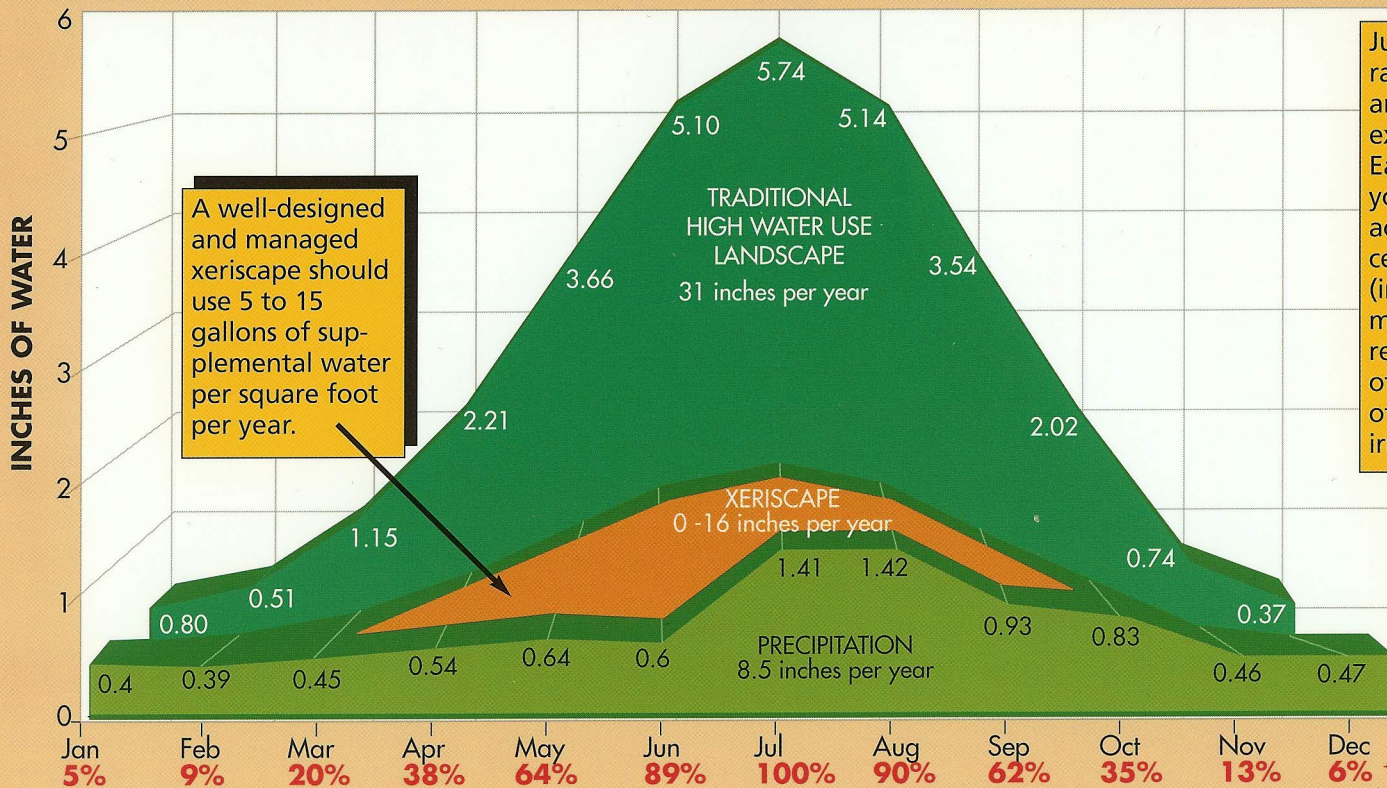


RED DROP DAY

We've got rain! Don't water! Nature's taking care of it for us.



Use this chart to make **MONTHLY TIMER ADJUSTMENTS** based on historical weather conditions



A well-designed and managed xeriscape should use 5 to 15 gallons of supplemental water per square foot per year.

July has the highest rate of evaporation and plant transpiration, expressed as 100% ET. Each month, adjust your timer down according to the percentage in the chart (in red % below each month)—either by reducing the number of days or the number of minutes per day of irrigation.
